TONIGHT'S DEMONSTRATOR

PETER CANGIALOSI

Our demonstrator tonight is Peter Cangialosi. Peter is a graphic designer, printmaker and woodworker living in Holyoke.

He specializes in relief and monotype prints. Eight of his monotype landscapes are part of the Boston Athenaeum's permanent collection. In 2019 he began building bespoke furniture,(custom made) picture frames, and various household items, turning raw materials into something not only functional but unique.

His art deco style lamps are a combination of fine hardwoods and stained glass panels which are crafted by hand.

Peter will bring his beautifully hand made lamps and woodcuts. He will show and discuss the process of his craft with some tools and examples of materials he uses, such as carved woodblock and carving tools. He will bring the parts and the pieces to show the construction his lamps.
